Once a year a convention is held in each region of the country. The purpose is for Bible teaching and spiritual encouragement of young churches. On February 22-26 a convention will be held in the North West region. On March 1-5 a convention will be held in the West region of Burkina Faso. Please pray for these conventions.

We have some special prayer requests regarding our secondary school in Bobo. Please pray for the teachers and the students. This school is located in a very poor and underdeveloped area. Most of the students come from homes with no running water or electricity. Without lights at night, they cannot study, so some come to our school in the evenings where some solar light is provided.

Along with the poverty, we are seeing something new—drugs. We don't know what kind of drugs or where they come

from, but youth are trying to dull the pain of hunger, illness, and many other problems. We have three or four of our secondary students on drugs now. One is asking for prayer that he will be able to stop using drugs. Please pray for this young man and others that drugs are entrapping.

Every student is precious to us and even more to our Lord. One of the young people in our Bethesda Home for widows and orphans has epileptic seizures. Medicine does not keep the seizures in check and you can imagine how distressed teachers would be with a student who may have a seizure at any time. Now he is no longer in school. He wants to be a musician, and we are praying that the Lord will lead and provide a way for this young man to use the gifts that God has given him. Please pray for Ahmed and his 66-year-old father. Pray that his father will accept Jesus Christ as Savior.



Pray for Dr. Moussa and our brothers and sisters as they seek to help every child, youth, and adult develop into the people God has planned for them to be.



Eugenie has been in our program almost from the beginning. She has been through many hardships, but she can smile, first of all, because Jesus loves her, and, second, because of all the care and love she is receiving from God's people.
